## **Parent Consultations**



# In School This Week.....

The good weather has allowed Mercury Class to get outside and really enjoy our PE lessons this week. The children enjoyed tag rugby with Mr Pitman, working on running with the ball and passing while moving. On Tuesday we have been perfecting our ball skills with our feet focusing on passing, dribbling and scoring goals. The children then enjoyed some free play where they could play football, use the climbing trail or play basketball. Lots of fun was had by all while learning and perfecting new skills.



Neptune have been using the skills they have developed during their English lessons to write their own Non-chronological reports all about Polar Bears! They have used all of the features including headings and subheadings, labelled diagrams and even a picture with a pun in the caption.



In Saturn we have really enjoyed writing our non-chronological report about the pangolin. We have been focusing on writing chunks to describe the features of a pangolin that make it quite different to other mammals. We have even been using tape to pick up crumbs around the classroom to mimic how a pangolin eats its food as it doesn't have teeth!



This week Little Stars have been exploring Autumnal objects. We've had pumpkins and used tweezers to pick out the seeds. We have also been learning how to write the letters: h, r, j and v.
